### HOT CROSS BUNS

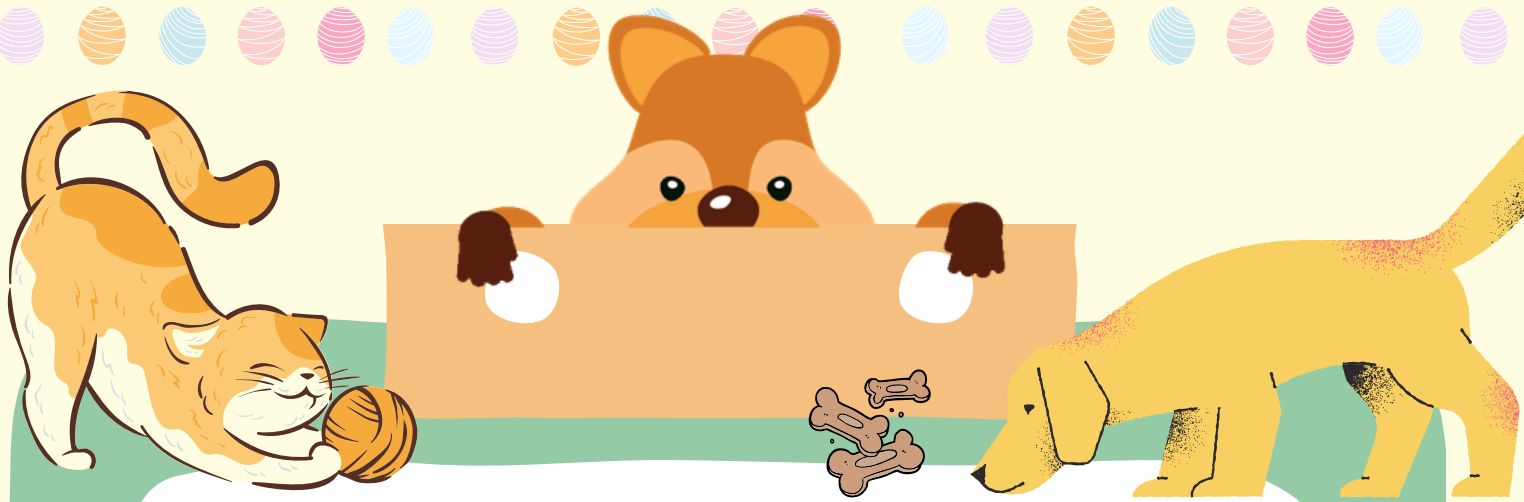
Hot cross buns, tasty as they are, contain raisins, currants and sultanas - all of which are poisonous to our pets.
